About the Block Fest Artist Activators Residency

What is Block Fest?

Block Fest celebrates the Tenderloin and our block of Turk Street with free arts activities, community information, and discussion. Every Friday, from 3pm–5pm, Artist Activators host unique activities, workshops, or conversations for anyone who lives, works, or plays in the Tenderloin. From interactive performances and conversations to screen printing workshops and crochet jams, Block Fest has Tenderloin neighbors returning on a weekly basis. The program has been running monthly since November 2016 and is being expanded to weekly in the Fall of 2018. Block Fest is presented in partnership with Central City SRO Collaborative.

What is the opportunity?

Artist Activators are the creative force for each Block Fest. Artist Activators are responsible for four consecutive Block Fests across one month. The Artist Activator residency is 8 months long, though most of the work will happen during your specific month of activities. Additional commitments Artist Activators should expect are attending three cohort meetings, and volunteering at 2 other Block Fests during your 8 months in residence. The stipend for Artist Activators is \$900, with an option to receive a \$100 stipend for additional engagement work (writing on the blog and hosting an additional activity).

What kind of activities do Artist Activators host?

Artist Activators propose the activity in this application and the activity is designed with CounterPulse's support. Each Block Fest activity in an Artist's month can be the same or a themed series. Activities by Artist Activators can be visual arts based or they can be relational, performative, conversational, or participatory. Below are some tips for developing a competitive proposal for your month of activities:

- A goal of Block Fest is to create public space for neighbors to engage with each other, so activities that spark conversation are great!
- Another goal of Block Fest is to create spaces of respite. CounterPulse provides shade, table, seating, and snacks; we encourage Artist Activators to consider how their projects can also provide respite
- The activities should be designed that anyone can drop in and participate easily with minimal instruction
- Activities should have different levels of engagement, some participants may want to participate for the whole two hours, and others may want to only drop in for 15 minutes
- We encourage all Artist Activators to deeply consider how the invitation for participation is made (e.g. to people passing by on the street) and to consider this as part of the activity
- We preference activities that celebrate what makes the Tenderloin special and/or projects that surface underheard community concerns
- Block Fest is designed primarily for adult residents of the Tenderloin, though families and children also stop by. Activities should be appropriate for all ages and skill levels

Who should apply?

This opportunity is designed for artists or community members who:

- Strive to eliminate boundaries between disciplines, artists and audience, and divergent communities
- Include public interaction and engagement as part of their creative process
- Value the social-bond and empathy building power of arts experiences
- Are self-starting and able to thrive in a DIY environment
- Have vision for the arts as a tool for social justice and community action
- Tenderloin residents are encouraged to apply
- Teams are encouraged to apply. Teams will determine for themselves how to split the stipend, which is the same as the stipend for individuals
- Disabled, Visually Impaired, and/or Deaf people are encouraged to apply for this residency. Please let us know what accomodations, if any, we can provide
- Multilingual artists are encouraged to apply. We do currently have resources for translation accomodations for Spanish-speaking applicants. We hope to be able to support more languages in the future. For all other languages besides Spanish, conversational English language skill is required. We can accept applications in English and Spanish

Commitments for Block Fest Residency:

- Artists will present four drop-in workshops, over a span of four consecutive Fridays during their given month, from 3pm–5pm
- Artists will attend 3 cohort meetings and volunteer at 2 other Block Fests during their residency
- Artists will critically evaluate their activity and the program during debriefs after each activity (conducted over the phone) and after their full month of Block Fests (in-person)
- Artists will receive a stipend of \$900 and a \$250 supply budget, there is option to receive an additional \$100 engagement stipend for writing blog posts (2) and doing an additional activity with CounterPulse sometime during your residency

Space & Support:

- Block Fest activities will occur outdoors in the 23' wide x 4' deep x 9' high front alcove and entryway of CounterPulse
- CounterPulse provides table, chairs, and a pop-up tent
- In case of rain or inclement weather, activities can happen in the lobby of CounterPulse, but should be planned to occur outside
- CounterPulse will provide 1 house manager during each activity to support with set-up, take down, and facilitating the activity. Any support needed beyond the house manager should be provided by the artist
- Artists will receive administration, production, and outreach support from CounterPulse
